Poetry Month!

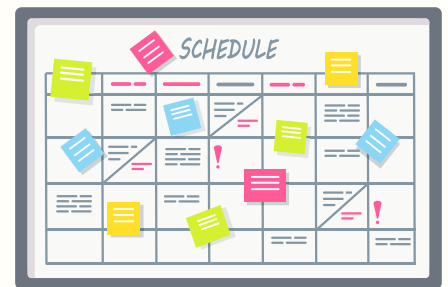
April is Poetry Month!

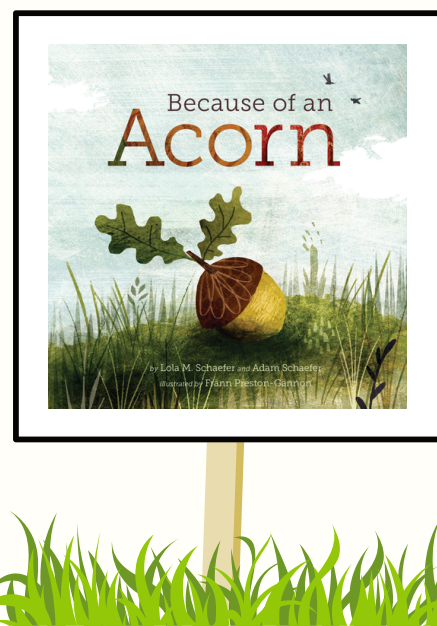
Old Timey Newspapers

Story Walk - Earth Day

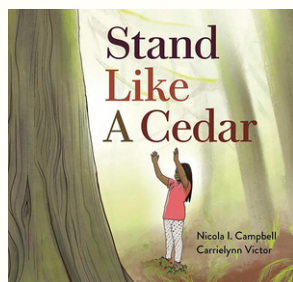
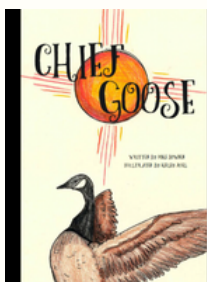
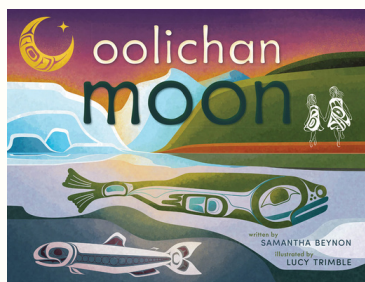
